Chapter Meeting—Lazy Days

John then announced elections for chapter officers for 2017. He advised that it is important that the chapter grow by adding new "younger" members and encouraged all to work at recruiting new members.

John announced that Dick Tracy had volunteered to take over as Chapter President unless there was anyone else willing to volunteer. Dick was elected by vote.

John announced that Marshall Godwin our current Vice President was willing to continue to serve as Vice President but asked if anyone else was willing to volunteer to be Vice President. The duties of Vice President were described. There being no volunteers Marshall was re-elected as Chapter Vice President

John then announced that Zane and Sue Murphy and Sue and Larry Runge will remain as Rally Masters.

John asked for volunteers to become Chapter Treasurer. There were none and Helen Blackwell was elected to remain as Chapter Treasurer.

John put out a call to ask someone to volunteer to be Chapter Secretary as outgoing Secretary, Maryanne Weinburg is stepping down due to personal reasons. There were no volunteers to become chapter secretary. That position is now vacant. Efforts will be made to recruit someone to fill that position.

DOAI National President, Ron Wacker was present and he pointed out that by holding our chapter meeting separately from the time of most of the other chapter meetings, which was done to accommodate the high number of members who are registered in both Blue Ridge And Mason Dixon chapters, that we may have lost an opportunity to gain more new members. We will do that differently at next year's rally.

John then turned the meeting over to Dick Tracy, incoming President. Dick asked for a treasurer's report and Helen gave that report (see attached) The chapter is in very good financial condition with a balance of over \$4,000. Dick then explained for the benefit of new members that the reason our chapter is financially strong is because we have received the benefit of proceeds of surplus funds remaining form SE Regional rallies that we have previously hosted.

Helen gave information on correspondence received. We have received a very nice note from Linda Zilinski thanking us for the chapter donation made to Wounded Warriors Foundation in the name of Lou Zilinski, Linda's husband who passed away in last November. A second letter from Linda was read in which she included a \$50 donation to the club and offered her praises for the warm friendship that the Mason Dixon members had been to she and Lou.

Dick opened discussion on new business of Mason Dixon's being the host for the 2018 SE Regional at Lazydays. Marshall Godwin has volunteered to be the Rally Master for that rally. Marshall gave information on the plans and work involved in hosting the SE regional and identified the positions that we must fill to make the rally a success. First and foremost is the position of Registrar and Treasurer. These duties may be combined. Dick offered that a National Rally checking account has been established and is in use for this current 2017 SE Regional and will be available for the 2018 rally. Deposits to this account may be made electronically thru use of cell phone to facilitate the process.

After much discussion, Pat Tracy volunteered to be the Registrar for the 2018 SE Regional.

Marshall went on to discuss his thoughts on the rally and suggested a possible theme would be Twenty Years and Still going Strong or something like that. The consensus was that such a theme would be good. We will have several other positions to fill and Marshall will be contacting individuals for their help. These would include things like Vendor, Goodie Bags and Decorations. We have received offers of assistance in putting on the rally by other chapters and we will call up on them as needed but want the key positions to be filled from the ranks of the Mason Dixons.

Helen discussed our next Mason Dixon Chapter rally. Our DOAI portion of the DOAI web page is being updated. After done please let Dick know if you see we need other changes.

Food for the Road

Recipes

Apple Crisp Delight

6-8 apples (pare and slice--I slice in eighths) 1/2 cup butter (or margarine)

1 cup sugar

3/4 cup flour

1 teaspoon cinnamon

Place apples in a greased, glass baking dish. (If apples are very dry, a bit of water may be placed in bottom of baking dish.) All other ingredients should be mixed together, almost as a pie crust. Press mixture on top of apples. Bake at approximately 350 degrees for 35 to 40 minutes (however brown and crispy you'd like!)

That's it! This is so good, you may consider making two. I serve it with real whipped cream on top.


