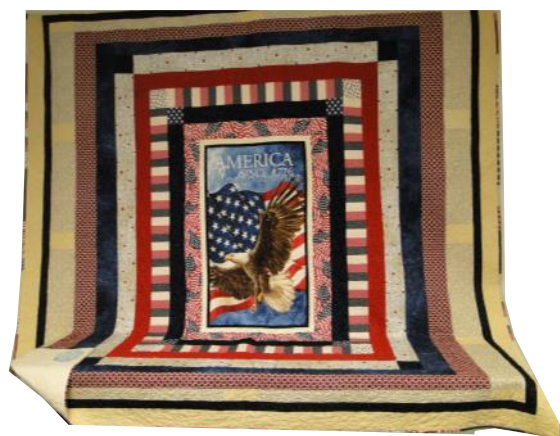

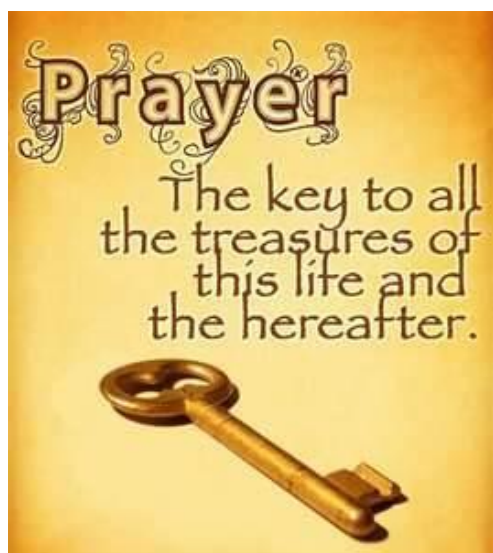

Jalapeno Cheese Dip About 2 quarts

- 1 pound hamburger (I use 98% fat free)
- 1 pound hot sausage
- 1 medium onion, finely chopped
- 2 pounds of Velveeta Cheese
- 1 16 ounce jar of hot or medium Salsa



Brown the hamburger and sausage stirring until done (small fine pieces).
Place in a medium to large crock pot or warmer and add onion and salsa to the mix
Serve hot in bowl with scoop chips or chips of your choice

Note: I add about 1/4 cup of white wine to mine if it starts getting to thick

May be frozen and reheated in the microwave or a warmer

Amish Pasta Salad (12 Cups Servings)

Ingredients:

- 1 (16 oz.) box medium pasta shells
- 5 eggs, hard boiled and chopped
- 1 cup celery, chopped
- 1/2 cup sweet onion
- 1 (2 oz.) jar of pimentos, drained
- 1 cup green pepper, chopped
- 3 Tbs. sweet pickle relish, drained
- 1/4 tsp. garlic powder
- 1/2 tsp. paprika
- 1/4 tsp. black pepper
- 1/2 tsp. celery seed
- 1 1/2 cups mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 2 Tbs. yellow mustard
- 3 tsp. apple cider vinegar



Cook pasta according to directions, drain.

In a large bowl, combine pasta, eggs, onion, pimentos, celery, green peppers and relish.

In another bowl, combine garlic powder, paprika, black pepper, celery seed, mayonnaise, sour cream, mustard, vinegar. Pour mayo mixture over the pasta mixture and mix well. You can sprinkle with more paprika, cover, and refrigerate for several hours or overnight. This makes about 12 cups and keeps for several days in the refrigerator.

Note: If past gets dry, add a little mayo. Also can add Tuna, Chopped Ham, chicken or turkey
